Wanderlust: An AUTObiography Cheryl Anne Lorance

I started working on the *Wanderlust Series* for fYREGALLERY two years prior to the exhibit. With the freedom to create a new body of work I decided the content would celebrate the joy of being outside in the open air, so I had to figure out what that would look like. When working on a new idea my process involves time to brainstorm and I often turn to past sketchbooks to refresh and stimulate my creativity. They are full of ideas and notes I've gathered for later use. Sometimes I harvest an idea from my collection, or peruse the pages to help me manifest a new one. I kept coming back to my sketches of landscapes and cityscapes but they needed something more. I let my mind *wander* until the idea felt right.

I was doing large, loose gesture drawings and by chance, saw a picture of a vintage camper. While drawing in a carefree state of mind I made a sketch of a mysterious caravan disappearing into the distance, its red taillights leaving a trail. It stirred such a sense of mystery. Where did I send it? The only way to know was to "follow it", to create another drawing. I continued to make them and knew my series had begun. While I drew I started to reminisce about places I've traveled, so I looked through old photos for references, using images from Colorado to Italy to the Dominican Republic. The drawings are a mix of made-up and real places.

My intention was to create a space somewhere between fact and fiction, evoking a feeling of a dream or a memory. I experimented with various types of light effects: day/night, glowing lanterns, fires, headlights/taillights, moonlight, and reflected snow. It was important to create a feeling of nostalgia, whimsy, and mystery.

As I made each drawing I went from one place to another. Through the caravan, I sensed freedom, independence, and adventure. I could see the caravan representing a desire to break the structure of routine, packing only the essentials, and escaping the familiar messes and responsibilities of everyday life. The vulnerability of being a loner lost on the freedom to wander.

This series became so much more than a celebration of the great outdoors; it embraces the joy of wandering from one adventure to another with gleeful abandon. I hope these drawings let you escape to a place of joy and wonder. The state of *Wanderlust* is a blissful place; there is no room for doubt. When you wander you never have to feel lost, the next stop is just around the bend, through the woods, beyond that hill, or over the bridge...

Are we there yet?

Always.
